

Fees and Services



In some cases, insurance may cover the cost of Psychoeducational Assessments. But more commonly, this type of service is Self-Pay and requires a One-Time Fee that covers the following:

- ◆ Administration of Psychological and Educational Assessments
- ◆ Scoring of Tests and Analyses and Integration of Test Results
- ◆ Written Report Preparation
- ◆ Feedback Session (i.e., discussion of Test Results and Recommendations)

Scheduling an Appointment

Parents are encouraged to schedule an initial consultation with one of our Providers to learn more about whether this type of testing can help your child.

The testing process takes anywhere from 5 to 8 hours and is usually divided into 2 sessions. Your child will meet with one of our providers individually, and breaks will be given throughout the appointment. For your convenience, Saturday appointments are available in addition to times during the week.

Do You Have These Concerns about Your Child?

Is your child ...

- ◆ Struggling with a particular subject area, such as reading, writing, or math?
- ◆ Having difficulties maintaining his or her attention and focus in the classroom?
- ◆ Experiencing a decline in academic performance after having entered college?
- ◆ Significantly influenced by how information is presented in the classroom, impacting his or her academic performance?



- ◆ Falling behind in school, yet you are unclear why?
- ◆ Experiencing emotional concerns, worries, or sadness that seems to be impacting his or her functioning at school?
- ◆ Communicating in a manner that you feel is different from his or her peers?

What is Psychoeducational Testing?



Psychoeducational testing explores the way that **cognitive functions** and **psychological factors** influence **academic skills**, including reading, writing, and mathematics.

Cognitive functions include memory and organizational abilities, while psychological factors may include anxiety, impulsivity, and inattention.

The assessment will also evaluate the way your child learns and determine his or her strengths and weaknesses within different areas.

Following an evaluation, specific recommendations are made for your child that can be used at home, at school, or in other relevant areas of his or her life.



What Types of Tests are Included?

Tests are included to assess a child's:

- ◆ Intellectual and Cognitive abilities
- ◆ Academic Achievement
- ◆ Visual Processing and Fine Motor Skills
- ◆ Attention and Concentration
- ◆ Executive Functioning (including memory, planning, organization)
- ◆ Behavior, Emotional Functioning, and Adaptive skills

What Recommendations May Be Made?

Accommodations may be requested for your child's school or college to facilitate a classroom environment that improves learning. Information obtained from this testing may also be used to inform 504 / Individual Educational Plans (IEPs).

Types of accommodations may include:

- ◆ Extended time on tests and/or assignments
- ◆ Preferential seating
- ◆ Extra support and tutoring services
- ◆ Techniques for enhancing learning vulnerabilities

Our licensed clinical psychologists also work closely with the Pediatric Neurology staff at Associated Neurologists for coordination of care and follow-up treatment.
